In the last year alone, we supported 30+ leaders through 4 NASS sponsored programmes, including social care leadership and School Improvement Partner training. We are also building a strong network of NASS SIPs that can offer support to other NASS members.



Piloting innovation

We look for innovative ways to tackle issues that affect you by collaborating with industry experts. We give you the opportunity to be part of this research. For example, our recent staff wellbeing pilot project involved 12 of our member schools.

NASS operates a rolling membership.
